

Why Internal Traffic Control Plans (ITCP's) Matter

- The biggest risk on a construction site isn't just public traffic—**it's our own trucks and equipment.**

Most serious incidents happen when:

- Workers are struck by moving or backing vehicles
- People enter blind spots
- Crews and equipment mix without a plan

A strong ITCP:

- Controls where trucks and equipment travel
- Separates workers on foot from moving equipment
- Reduces backing and confusion
- Establishes safe walking routes and work zones
- It makes the job predictable—and predictable is safe.



Why Following the Plan Matters: **The plan only works if everyone follows it.**

- When it's ignored:
 - Trucks move unpredictably
 - Workers take shortcuts through traffic
 - Communication breaks down
 - Risk of serious injury goes way up

What We Expect From You

- Follow designated haul routes and walking paths
- Stay out of equipment and truck travel lanes
- Never assume an operator sees you—make eye contact
- Don't take shortcuts through active work zones
- **Speak up if something doesn't look right**

Bottom Line; A strong ITCP:

- Keeps people separated from equipment
- Controls movement across the site
- Prevents struck-by incidents
- The plan is only effective if we all follow it—every time.
